HONEY JUDGING GUIDELINES

Classes 0101 and 0201

All entries must be in a 1lb Queenline type GLASS jar with plain metal or plastic lid.

Classes 0102, 0202, 0104 and 0204

All entries must be in a GLASS jar with no label or logo on or in the glass.

All entries must have a solid lid of plain metal or plastic with no logos, labels or printing.

All Extracted honey will be judged on:

- 1. Density water content above 18.6% will be disqualified
- 2. Absence of crystals
- 3. Cleanliness of honey Without lint, without dirt, without wax particles, without foam
- 4. Flavor ONLY for honey flavor adversely affected by processing
- 5. Container appearance and cleanliness
- 6. Accuracy of filling

All Classes with Chunk Comb:

- 1. Neatness and uniformity of cut Upgrade for parallel and 4-sided cuts; downgrade for ragged edges
- 2. Absence of watery cappings, uncapped cells and pollen
- 3. Cleanliness of product Down-grade for travel stains, foreign matter, wax, foam or crystallization
- 4. Uniformity of appearance in capping structure, color, and accuracy of fill
- 5. One (1) piece of comb (bottom to fill line) in jar

Cut Comb Honey – Classes 0106 and 0206:

- 1. Neatness and uniformity of cut, absence of liquid honey
- 2. Absence of watery cappings, uncapped cells and pollen
- 3. Cleanliness of product, absence of travel stains, crushed wax
- 4. Uniformity of appearance

Beeswax - Class 0107:

The optimum color for pure beeswax is light canary to straw yellow.

- 1. Single piece of pure beeswax
- 2. minimum 1 pound (16 oz.) not to exceed 17 oz
- 3. Shapes accepted are: Hexagonal, Rectangular and Circular
- 4. Only imprints of a Honey Bee or the word Beeswax will be allowed NO other markings or designs

Wax Judging Criteria:

Cleanliness Absence of cracks and shrinkage, Color Uniformity of appearance and Aroma
